A1-level goals for practice A1 = elementary language skills

- >>> Under the mentor's guidance, the student gets to know the communication environment of the intership
- The student recognizes the different roles and goals of language in different situations (converstation with the client, documentation, reporting)
- The student learns to notice non-linguistic cues (tone of voice, facial expressions, gestures, emphasis)
- The student learns to pick up expressions that are repeated in the work environment (greetings, sentences, words)
- The student participates in the conversation in short predictable and routine situations



A2 –level goals for practice

A2.1 = the initial states of basic language skills

- The student is able to exchange information familiar situations, but has to ask for clarification often
- The student can cope with short interaction situations and knows how to use greetings and polite expressions
- The student understands familiar, short expressions, the content of short messages of intrest
- The student can briefly talk about everyday things and things that are important to her/him
- The student knows easily predictable basic vocabulary and many of the most important structures

A2.2 = Developing basic language skills

- The student moderately copes with everyday communication situations and is capable of initiative
- The student knows how to use language in a simple way for the most essential purposes, such as exchanging information and expressing opinions and attitudes appropriately.
- The student is able to converse using standard expressions and basic communication routines ad to list things
- The student identifies the main topics of conversations and texts



B1-level goals for practise

B1.1 = Fuctional language skills in normal work and leisure situations

- The student understands the main points and a few details about regularly recurring themes from a speech
- The student understands texts on familiar topics and is able to reason things out
- The student know how to communicate key recurring issues as well as slightly more demanding situations and copes with everyday situations and informal conversations
- The student knows how to write clearly connected text and convey familiar information effectively in the most common situations

B1.2 = Fluent language skills in normal work and leisure situations

- The students understans clear factual information on familiar, general topics and in somewhat more demanding contexts
- The student's understanding requires common language and a familiar accent
- The student knows how to talk about ordinary, concrete topics by describing, detailing and comparing, and communicates intelligibly, fluently and clearly in most practical situations.
- The student can write to most common topical texts and can present supporting information for the main ideas, structure the text and take the reader account in some way..





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
